#### Word of the president

Hello to all members,

I Time flies and another convention is already behind us. Thank you to everyone who attended. We are now at the preparation stage for the fall visits. In this message, the subjects I will cover are 24 hour or disciplinary notices, hours reductions, the negotiations, disinformation and our next convention.

#### 24 Hour Notices

There has been an increase in 24 hour or disciplinary notices. Since January 2018, we have had to assist no less than fifteen of our members with disciplinary meetings, compared to less than ten for the same period last year. The reasons for the dissatisfaction are mainly not following procedures and non-compliance with work schedules. I would like to point out that when you're called in by the employer, you are only human and it's normal to be on the defensive. This can unfortunately lead you to say too much. So remember to stick to the facts and reply with answers that are short, clear and to the point.

#### Hours Reductions:

I would like not to have to discuss this issue with you again, but it seems there's little chance of that. The Trudeau government directive is still in force, which means that the consultations concerning hours reductions cannot affect customer service hours or Saturday closures. On the employer side, all vacated positions are reviewed. Since the publication of the last newsletter, we have had consultations for 11 post offices, 2 of which were concerning hours increases. What the new strategy will be to achieve their objectives we don't know and no information has filtered through so far. We do know, however, that all of the new technology does not serve only to provide better customer service, but also to save time in terms of labour. Now, sequenced sorting is an added factor and in post offices where this system has been implemented, almost 100% of the mail is sorted accordingly. The lack of space due to an increase in package mail in some offices can lead to the need to change some rural routes. A lot of small things often appear harmless, but create opportunities to reduce the number of work hours in our post offices. I won't dwell here on the volunteer work done by some of our members or the skipping of meal and rest breaks. Just to say that when members do this, it gives the employer the wrong impression about their productivity when they haven't had the time to finish all of their duties. It's a pity, because, following their departure, we lack the arguments required to provide proof of the work hour needs in these post offices.

#### Negotiations:

We will soon be reviewing your demands and need to be prepared for the upcoming negotiations. Our goal is to work for you and with you. Based on past negotiations, the demands are similar to those of previous negotiations, Sections 11 and 20 being the most popular. So we won't reinvent the wheel.

#### To contact us:

A lot of members continue to write us using the RPS system. I am still wondering how to make members understand that when you write to us through your RPS system, we cannot reply to you directly because the Canada Post system does not give us this kind of access. In order for us to communicate with you, you must leave us your contact information.

#### New Option:

I I don't know if many of you have had a chance to use the new option for the payment of income tax directly through the post office. It's a simple tool that does the job. Don't hesitate to promote it and use it yourself. It counts as time that your RPS systems are in use.

#### Disinformation:

It becomes very difficult to defend certain situations when your only excuse is "I didn't know". It's your obligation to get informed. It's one of your duties. We also hear "I never call the union", which is sad because we lare here to help you.

#### 2019 Convention:

This is an election year for your union officers, so the 2019 Convention will take place at the Hôtel le Concorde in Québec City. You will be called upon to also choose the delegates to the next triennial national convention to be held in Saskatchewan.

#### Acknowledgements:

I would like to thank my team. I know I repeat the same thing every year, but it is always relevant. A huge I thank you to my dear colleagues for your support. It's not always easy. And a special thanks to Chantal Nault, my right hand, and sometimes my left hand. I am sure that all of you will continue your excellent work with the usual high degree of professionalism.

And everyone should never forget that TOGETHER, ALL CPAA MEMBERS MAKE A REAL DIFFERENCE!


